


9. If you responded Yes to question (C), you are required to complete an Impact Statement, based on the Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines, and submit it to the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada to initiate the Impact Assessment process.

When the Impact Assessment Agency has determined the need for an IA, they will advise you on how to proceed. You must keep NSERC apprised of the Notice of Intent and Notice of Decision of the Impact Assessment.

If no IA is required, NSERC will require a copy of the related correspondence as confirmation.

10. If you responded Yes to question (D), you **must** keep NSERC informed of the status of any planned or ongoing Impact Assessments.

Note: In cases described in points 9 and 10 above, no grant funds will be released until NSERC receives written confirmation from the Impact Assessment Agency that no IA is needed OR that a decision statement has been issued which confirms that there will be no significant adverse environmental effects or that Cabinet has justified the effects under the circumstances.
